HOPE GARDEN RULES

This document sets out the rules that govern the HOPE Garden (the "Garden"). These Rules are intended to help all our Gardeners grow fresh, healthy foods in a thriving garden, to help create a sense of community among our gardeners, and to help the Garden be a good neighbor.

HOPE Lutheran (the "Sponsor") is a nonprofit organization that owns the land for the Garden, sponsors the garden, and administers these Rules. Every person who has a plot in the Garden (called "Gardeners") must sign a legal agreement with Sponsor in which the Gardener agrees to comply with these Rules.

A. ACCESS TO THE GARDEN

Season – the garden is open and accessible May – early November

Hours – Gardeners may be in the Garden from sunrise to sunset.

Parking – Gardeners may park in the church parking lot, or enter the garden in designated area provided by HOPE.

B. GARDEN PLOTS

Use of own plot:

- · Gardeners use only the plot assigned to them by the Sponsor
- · Gardeners maintain their plants within their plots and trim any plants that extend into the neighboring plots or common areas.
- · Gardeners may not alter the dimensions of their plots.

Plantings:

- · Gardeners may plant vegetables and annual flowers
- · Gardeners may not grow plants or put up structures that impeded the growth in adjacent plots.
- · All gardeners must begin gardening show evidence of being in the garden by the end of Memorial Day weekend or have contacted the volunteer coordinator and received permission to delay the start of gardening.

Supplies:

• Gardeners plan and manage of their own plots, including providing: seeds, plants, fertilizer, and tools. NO herbicides and/or pesticides that is not certified organic is allowed in the garden.

Water:

- · Gardeners water their own plants
- · No water available at the site.

Tools:

- · Gardeners bring their own tools for gardening.
- · Gardeners are responsible for any damage caused by their tools and so use tools with care
- · Gardeners may NOT use tools that require gasoline, electricity, or batteries.

Plot Maintenance & Trash:

- · Gardeners maintain their plots and adjacent paths in a clean and neat manner by removing weeds, overgrowth, or waste from their plot.
- · Gardeners promptly harvest edible plants
- · Gardeners remove; transport and dispose of their own garden reuse and weeds in the designated compost area.

· Personal trash is disposed off-site.

Yearly Clean-up:

- · Gardeners complete an end of season clean-up on their plot by the end of October.
- · All weeds and old plant material must be removed.
- No landscape fabric, plastic, cages, tools etc may be stored in the garden over winter.

Absence:

- · Gardeners actively maintain their plot.
- · An absence of > 2 week should be communicated to Sponsor. An absence > 1 month is considered abandonment and loss of the plot. Gardener is informed via email or phone of plot forfeiture.

Personal Property:

· Gardeners are responsible for all personal property in the plot when they are not gardening.

C. COMMON AREAS

- · Gardeners keep common areas adjacent to their plot neat and clean.
- · Damage created by weather or vandals is cleaned and tidied by gardeners.

D. COMMUNICATION

Garden Management:

· The Sponsor has complete authority to interpret the Rules and make decisions

Communication:

· The Sponsor designates a Volunteer Garden Coordinator

Contact Information:

· Gardeners inform the Volunteer Garden Coordinator of changes in their contact email and/or phone number

Gardener Input:

· Gardeners are encouraged to provide suggestions to the Volunteer Garden Coordinator through email.

Spring Gardener Orientation

· To be determined.
