

Blessed are the Ones...

I hope you enjoyed our January series on Sabbath rest. Over the course of three weeks we learned that Sabbath is part of God's created order, Sabbath is a gift given to us to help us avoid burnout in doing God's work, and Sabbath is an act of God's justice in the world. As we wrapped up this series last Sunday, I encouraged you to set an intention for how you will live into the Sabbath command moving forward. If you have not already done so, I encourage you to take a few moments to set such an intention. My intention is to be a Sabbath permission-giver, especially for this faith community. You are entitled to Sabbath simply because you were made in love by God. We honor God when we grant space for Sabbath for ourselves and one another. We are better able to hear God and discern where God is leading us next, when we are not too tired to do so. This year, I wonder how God might be calling us to do more by doing less—to go deeper, to focus on our relationship to God and one another, to simply be blessed by God?

This Sunday we hear the opening words to the Sermon on the Mount from Matthew 5. You know them as "The Beatitudes." Within these verses, Jesus names who is blessed and what they shall receive. Certainly we are part of God's blessed and beloved. What does God hope we receive? In exploring the sermon on the mount anew, I've been using the *First Nations Version: An Indigenous Translation of the New Testament. It has helped me go a bit deeper in my reflections and understanding. I can think of no better mentor than our indigenous siblings, to remind us of the wholeness that awaits when we better understand our connection to our Creator, the earth, and one another. There seems to be a Sabbath way about it. I share that translation with you here so you, too, may be blessed by a new, deeper, Sabbath-oriented perspective:*

Matthew 5:1-12, "Blessings of the Good Road"

When Creator Sets Free (Jesus) saw this great crowd, he went back up into the mountainside and sat down to teach the people. His followers came to him there, so he took a deep breath, opened his mouth, and began to share his wisdom with them and teach them how to see Creator's good road.

"Creator's blessing rests on the poor, the ones with broken spirits. The good road from above is theirs to walk. Creator's blessing rests on the ones who walk a trail of tears, for he will wipe the tears from their eyes and comfort them.

Creator's blessing rests on the ones who walk softly and in a humble manner. The earth, land, and sky will welcome them and always be their home.

Creator's blessing rests on the ones who hunger and thirst for wrongs to be made right again. They will eat and drink until they are full.

Creator's blessing rests on the ones who are merciful and kind to others. Their kindness will find its way back to them-full circle.

Creator's blessing rests on the pure of heart. They are the ones who will see the Great Spirit.

Creator's blessing rests on the ones who make peace. It will be said of them, 'they are the children of the Great Spirit.'

Creator's blessing rests on the ones who are hunted down and mistreated for doing what is right, for they are walking the good road from above.

Others will lie about you, speak against you, and look down on you with scorn and contempt, all because you walk the road with me. This is a sign that Creator's blessing is resting on you. So let your hearts be glad and jump for joy, for you will be honored in the spirit-world above. You are like the prophets of old, who were treated in the same way by your ancestors."

How do we build up our neighbors?


Instead of collecting items as we've done in the past, we plan to bring in speakers to help us learn more about our neighbors as we engage in the mission of listening and learning.


The driveway at the Oppegards has been cleared out and the ice has been deglazed so folks that wish to make donations of food can personally deliver it themselves.
