



# This Lent we ask, "Who Is Our Neighbor?"

This Lent we come together in bold vulnerability to acknowledge that one of the most faithful things we do as the people of God is *ask questions*. To wonder, to ask, or to doubt are signs of our longing to know God better. One way we can understand our God better, is through seeking to understand *our neighbors* better, for we know that we are each made in the *imago Dei* (image of God), and as we grow in our understanding of one another, then we certainly come to understand more about the fullness of God.

Over the last few weeks our Mission Ministry team invited you to share about neighbors you were interested in learning more about. We have heard your wondering and are bringing speakers to join us each week to guide us in learning about these neighbors. We encourage you to come and listen with open and curious hearts, minds, and spirits for what God is hoping to reveal to us about God's very self though the next few weeks.

This week brings us two beautiful opportunities for such listening and wondering: THIS SUNDAY AFTER WORSHIP: "Building An Inclusive Church" In-

formational Session (Who is my LGBTQIA+ and BIPOC Neighbor?)

All are invited to participate in this introductory informational session on the Building an Inclusive Church (BIC) congregational training. BIC training helps design and implement a journey for your faith community to publicly and intentionally welcome people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions, and incorporate a commitment to the work of racial equity. Building an Inclusive Church equips you with ways to create dialogue, deepening relationships throughout your faith community rather than sparking debate and division. For this conversation we welcome Deacon David Behling (of UWRF's Journey House Campus Ministry) who will guide us in our exploration and wonder about this process. You can learn more HERE.

#### WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8th: Who Is My Cross-Cultural Neighbor?

Mr. Salvador Valadez, who grew up in Mexico and currently lives in Baldwin while working in the Cities, will join us to share his perspective during worship. He will share about his present social location, his dreams, his challenges, and how we might strive to be better neighbors to those like him.
