

Week Four: Questions that Change, Questions that Change You

This week we are immersed in the story of John 9, the story of a man born blind who receives his sight. For our further exploration this midweek, we are centering in on <u>John 9:18-28</u>.

Take a moment to re-read this text, and then explore the following questions:

Questions about Questions

This week's preaching commentary notes that the Pharisees are bogeymen in the Gospel of John. A direct way to really understand their position is by identifying yourself with them. So humbly consider:

- ✤ When did you judge others before you knew what you know now?
- ✤ How did your questions drive others away?
- Or, consider a time when you were asking the wrong question about God or what God has done.
- ✤ What did you learn that opened your eyes to your mistake?

Practice

Admitting when questions have steered us down an unproductive path

The invitation: Today you are encouraged to think and share about a time when God surprised you, or a time when you felt the people at church were asking the wrong questions about God.

First, spend some time in prayerful journaling with these questions.

Second, if you join tonight's soup supper, you are invited to share these questions with your table mates for further exploration. If you have other plans this evening, then I encourage you to have a chat with a faithful conversation partner over the phone or throughout the rest of the week sometime:

- ✤ When was a time that God defied your expectations?
- ✤ What do you think we obsess about at church, and what better question would you like us to ask?



I am Madison Ziebarth, I am 18 years old and I run a small bakery out of my home called MaddieZbakes.



First Sunday of the Month Special Collections

The River Falls School District has 112 children signed up for the Backpack Program this year. This program falls under the auspices of Our Neighbors' Place and is primarily funded by The Black Tie Affair held every April and donations. It does not receive any help from the River Falls Food Pantry.

Therefore, the Mission Ministry through HOPE would like to start collecting donations for the Backpack Program on the first Sunday of each month alternating with the Food Pantry.

The Magic Box works in the same manner as for the Food Pantry, whereas each dollar magically will have \$5 of purchasing power. The next opportunity will be November 6, when your generous donations will support the Backpack Program.
