

In honor of Earth Day (Saturday, April 22), I wanted to highlight a lesser-known movement in the ELCA, *Lutherans Restoring Creation* (LRC).

As their website states, "Lutherans Restoring Creation is a grassroots movement promoting care for creation in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We accomplish this by cultivating a community of dedicated stewards of earth and neighbor who proclaim God's promise of hope and healing for all." The movement grew out of a long history of Lutheran concern for the environment, going as far back as 1993 in the ELCA with the Social Statement "Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice." The statement, which we studied last summer, explains the ELCA's teachings on ecology and the environment, grounded in a biblical vision of God's intention for the healing and wholeness of creation. LRC expands on the work of our predecessors to provide a variety of initiatives, suggestions, resources, and networking opportunities to empower institutions of the ELCA to move forward in our call to creation care. By lifting up our care of creation, we just might discover a deeper relationship with the very One who made that creation! LRC seeks to engage this work as a response to the grace of God manifested throughout creation, in the person of Jesus, and in communion with the Holy Spirit – knowing that it is ultimately God's creative and redemptive love for creation that prompts us and sustains us in this work.

LRC provides a number of resources to help us explore our faith through a creation-care lens. One annual resource they provide is a Creation Care focused worship service for Earth Day. You can find that full service <u>HERE</u>. We will be utilizing a few elements of this service as we gather this Sunday, April 23rd. In addition, LRC provides a number of helpful personal devotional resources, tools for growing in your own sustainability work, and more. 

Update from Our Neighbors' Place:

- 1) We are featured as a Target Circle giving partner this quarter (April, May, June). Many people don't know this but when you shop with Target Circle, you earn votes to vote for nonprofits. So you can vote for us and whatever percentage of the votes we get, we earn that percentage of the pool of money Target has to donate to community resources in the area.
- 2) We are doing a Clothing Swap for Earth Fest (in partnership with Wiley's Wardrobe). Bring 1-2 gently used adult clothing items to swap. 12-4pm on Sat, April 22 at Glen Park Pavilion.
- 3) We are hosting a BOGO Thrift Store Tour in River Falls. 4 participating stores are: The Closet (at Our Neighbors' Place); Second Chances; Treasures of the Heart; Second Star. Coupons are available at all 4 stores and the BOGO is good on clothing/apparel items. Sale goes through April 30th.


The backpack program meets the needs of children who may go hungry on weekends during the school year. Weekly backpacks contain 7-9 pounds of non-perishable food and vouchers for milk, meat, produce, bread and eggs.

Typically, we distribute to an average of 80 students per week - however for the **2022-23** school year, we have seen enrollment jump to **120** students per week.

The program is 100% operated by volunteers - it takes about 30 volunteers a month for the program to run smoothly. In partnership with the River Falls Lions Club, we offer a summer backpack program when school is not in session.

First Sunday of the Month Special Collections

The River Falls School District has 112 children signed up for the Backpack Program this year. This program falls under the auspices of Our Neighbors' Place and is primarily funded by The Black Tie Affair held every April and donations. It does not receive any help from the River Falls Food Pantry.

Therefore, the Mission Ministry through HOPE would like to start collecting donations for the Backpack Program on the first Sunday of each month alternating with the Food Pantry.

The Magic Box works in the same manner as for the Food Pantry, whereas each dollar magically will have \$5 of purchasing power. The next opportunity will be November 6, when your generous donations will support the Backpack Program.
