


"FROM BLOSSOMS," BY LI-YOUNG LEE


- Warm socks men's and women's

Please note that we are updating the security code to HOPE's main entrance. A new code has been established and distributed to council members who will help distribute it to ministry team volunteers and other active HOPE participants. **Both the old and new codes will work until October 1, 2023. Effective 10.01.23 only the new code will work.** Phone numbers will be posted on the door so anyone needing access can reach someone to help.

Why are we doing this?

- ⇒ We have not changed the code in 7 years and it's a wise plan to change it more frequently for security reasons.
- ⇒ The old code has been very widely distributed to those that do not need it and we want to maintain a welcoming and safe environment.
- ⇒ The use of the old code has resulted in wear and tear that makes seeing the numbers increasingly difficult. Property Team is looking at replacement as well.

We hope that by making these updates all HOPE members and guests can feel safe and welcome!

Meals should include some sort of protein and a couple vegetable sides, along with whatever condiments are needed for the meal. Desserts are optional.






Bakken-Young Suicide Loss Grief Support Webinar
