

This Sunday kicks off the beginning of our 2023 celebration of the Season of Creation! Each year from September 1 to October 4, the Christian family unites for this worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. HOPE celebrates in line with our God's Work, Our Hands Kick-off celebration, for a total of 4 weeks. God's Work, Our Hands Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America – one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. For 10 years now, ELCA congregations have engaged in service activities near this Sunday to offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: that all of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life – flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace. For the third year in a row we celebrate this as we kick off our Season of Creation celebration, embracing that we are called to care for creation as part of our acts of service, every day calling, and in every corner of our life.

As we do so, we join other followers of Christ from around the globe, in a common call to care for creation. We are co-creatures and part of all that God has made. Our wellbeing is interwoven with the wellbeing of the Earth. In this season we take time out to explore the depth of our interconnectedness with the rest of God's beautiful creation. The theme for 2023 is "Let Justice and Peace Flow." Prophet Amos cries out: "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5:24) and so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity. As the people of God, we must work together on behalf of all Creation, as part of that mighty river of peace and justice.

The symbol for 2023 is a mighty river. Biodiversity is being lost at a rate not seen since the last mass extinction. The futures of young people are threatened by the cascading impacts of the loss of biodiversity and a changing climate. The urgency grows and we must make visible peace with Earth and on Earth, at the same time that justice calls us to repentance and a change of attitude and actions. As we join the river of justice and peace with others then hope is created instead of despair! We have two opportunities to explore the Season of Creation: Sunday mornings here at HOPE and Sunday evenings at 5PM at a variety of ecumenical locations, hosted at HOPE this Sunday, September 10!

May God bless our time focused on this dimension of our discipleship and lead us to care for God's holy creation.








2024 ELCA NEW ORLEANS YOUTH GATHERING INFO MEETING!
