Pastoral Reflections from A Season of Creation

Earlier this week I attended the 2023 Northwest Synod of Wisconsin Fall Ministry Retreat with keynote speaker, Vance Blackfox, a citizen of the Cherokee Nation and ELCA director for Indigenous ministries and tribal relations. He graciously shared a presentation on Indigenous Theology with the pastors and deacons of our synod.

One tremendous gift, of many, our Indigenous siblings have to offer the wider Christian community is their sense of connectedness to creation. Their sense of time, place, and especially ceremony is not just connected to, but dependent on the land from which they came. Everything is honored and seen as purposeful. They humbly acknowledge that humans are dependent on Mother Earth, though not one single non-human relative of ours is dependent on us, and so every other piece of creation is honored. There is a symbiosis and a beauty that was deeply understood by Indigenous peoples that has been lost by most of us because of colonization and its aftermath

As I sat down for my own personal devotions and came across this prayer I couldn't help but see and hear the Holy Spirit's nudge about this symbiosis: "Praise from All Creatures" by Ted Loder in *Guerrillas of Grace: Prayers for the Bat-tle*

Praise be to you, O Lord, who spins shining stars across the wondrous heavens and stretches out the seas, who lifts the dawn into place and sets boundaries for night, who awes the earth with storms and gentles it with green, who gives everything a season and breathes life and love into the dust of me. Praise be to you.

Praise in all things for all things: the soft slant of sunlight; the sweat of battle, a song in the wilderness, the evening breeze, the deep breath, the tended wound, mercy, quietness, a friend; for the miracles of the daily, the mysteries of the eternal. Praise be to you.

Praise from all creatures, laughers, and list-makers, wonders and worries, poets and plodders and prophets, the wrinkled, the newborn, the whale, and the worm, from all and from me.

Praise, praise be to you for amazing grace.



As our celebration of the Season of Creation winds to an end this coming Sunday, October 1st, we are grateful to God for reminding us of our interconnectedness to *all* of God's beautiful creation! Of course this is worth celebrating, acknowledging, and honoring year-round. HOPE's Green Team has given us some wonderful ways to mindfully continue this celebration:

1. Renewable Energy Blocks:

The special offering for HOPE's renewable energy blocks is open through October 1! This enables us to be 100% renewable here at HOPE, and contributes to the offset of additional homes in our community! We have a goal of offsetting 12 additional homes this year (about 35 REBs per month in 2024)! So far this year we have raised \$295. Help us meet our goal! Donations may be mailed or dropped off to Olive in the church office. *Also consider updating your own River Falls Municipal Utilities bill to offset carbon emissions in your own home for only \$2 per block!* Get more info HERE

2. Plastic Film Recycling

We are excited to offer plastic film recycling right here at HOPE! This is a partnership with the UWRF and <u>Trex</u> to help turn our pounds of plastic film waste into beautiful and environmentally responsible outdoor products. The bin is located directly inside the front entryway. So start saving the following items:

- a. Grocery/produce bags
- b. Bread bags
- c. Bubble wrap
- d. Stretch wrap
- e. Ice bags
- f. Plastic shipping envelopes
- g. Ziploc and other food storage bags
- h. Cereal bags
- i. Case overwrap
- j. Salt bagswood pellet bags
- k. Newspaper sleeves

3. Battery Recycling

We also now have a dedicated battery recycling bucket here at HOPE! This process allows for the materials to be remade into new batteries. All alkaline batteries are acceptable. Other batteries need to be covered in clear tape to eliminate the threat of combustion: lithium primary (including button cell), lithium ion, sealed lead-acid, any battery greater than 9V, any battery you're unsure about. The "Battery Solutions" bucket is located near the entry.



FALL SESSION IS LIVE NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME


