Greetings, Grace and peace from the Hope Stewardship Ministry Team.

In the next four weeks we will reflect on how God generously puts grace into action, from home making to bridge building acts of mercy and how we, the children of God, created in the image of God, can do the same.

Let's start at the very beginning... a very good place to start. Right from the beginning of Genesis we see God as creator, organizer, decorator, feeder, teacher, gardener, and builder of this world we call home. In the beginning God separated the light from the dark and separated heaven and earth. He separated the dry land and the seas. Plastic waste is ubiquitous, long lasting, and potentially quite harmful to many facets of the environment. As stewards having the privilege of caring for this special place where we gather to worship the Creator and to be nurtured by God's Spirit and the beauty of our surroundings, we strive to protect and restore, rather than neglect and harm. We all have the opportunity to be caring stewards when we choose to be responsible consumers of resources and producers of waste by reducing our use of plastic where possible.

Thinking of the words from Ezekiel and Pastor Annie's recent sermon, we hope all can embrace this initiative as an opportunity to "Turn and Live". As we turn away from the convenience and availability of plastic, and seek less harmful options, we are not only sustaining life for ourselves, we protect the necessary elements of life for our world neighbors. We take a small step of faith toward cleaner water, more breathable air, and uncontaminated food for all.

As we engage in our ministry together, we encourage you to be mindful of the use of plastic supplies and packaging. For example, during God's Work, Our Hands Kick-Off Sunday, our Congregational Life team used compostable products rather than plastic and opted to wash silverware rather than use plastic utensils. For our upcoming Trunk or Treat, our Education and Congregational Life teams are refraining from plastic goodie bags, opting for paper instead, and being careful not to purchase more one time use plastic trinkets as goodies. A variety of HOPE homes, HOPE spaces, or community locations (breweries, restaurants, coffee shops) depending on your host!


Conversation will build from 3-4 facilitated guiding questions!

Have you ever wondered what our children and youth get up to on Wednesday nights here at HOPE?



FALL SESSION IS LIVE NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME


