#### Dear HOPE.

One of Jesus' most famous parables is usually called, "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." But this is actually a parable designed to teach us about the merciful, generous nature of God. And to the extent that "prodigal" means extravagant or over-the-top, that word is better applied to the father in the story.

The son comes home hoping for a modest meal in exchange for an apology. Before he can say a word, however, his father is lavishing him with love and making preparations for a party. For the prodigal parent, only a splendid celebration will do.

Jesus says that God – the Prodigal Parent – puts grace into action this way: welcoming us home even when we don't "deserve" it; forgiving us completely before we can even ask; and treating just the sight of us as cause for extravagant joy.

At our best, this sort of celebratory welcome is what HOPE is all about. Welcoming visitors and regulars alike into the beautiful choreography of worship and celebration. We strive to be a community of joy – prodigal, extravagant, and free – for anyone who longs for a meal, an embrace, and the reassurance that they are not alone.

This welcome is about repairing the world through love, one celebration at a time. That's "Grace in Action." You can hear it in the language we use: we celebrate Communion, celebrate Baptism, celebrate Easter, celebrate Christmas, celebrate Kickoff Sunday, celebrate weddings, celebrations of Life, etc.

At the end of this letter, you'll find a brief testimony from Keith Getschel about what this prodigal celebration feels like here at HOPE. We hope you'll read his thoughts on joy in our life and work together. And speaking of celebration: we're looking forward to celebrating Commitment Sunday with you on Sunday October 29. That will be a party you won't want to miss!

Linked here is the **2024 HOPE Commitment Card**. We will include it each week and whenever you see it, try praying the prayer printed within it. Spend time considering how you want to respond to God's Grace in Action. Then fill it out and submit it by Commitment Sunday, October 29th OR fill out a paper Commitment Card and bring it along on that day when we will joyfully put our God-given grace into action together!




# FALL SESSION NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME




Thinking of the words from Ezekiel and Pastor Annie's recent sermon, we hope all can embrace this initiative as an opportunity to "Turn and Live". As we turn away from the convenience and availability of plastic, and seek less harmful options, we are not only sustaining life for ourselves, we protect the necessary elements of life for our world neighbors. We take a small step of faith toward cleaner water, more breathable air, and uncontaminated food for all.

As we engage in our ministry together, we encourage you to be mindful of the use of plastic supplies and packaging. For example, during God's Work, Our Hands Kick-Off Sunday, our Congregational Life team used compostable products rather than plastic and opted to wash silverware rather than use plastic utensils. 

- c. Prayerfully consider if you are being called to help our young people come to know and love Jesus and the world God made.


#### 2. Worship Ministry Team
