#### Dear HOPE Family,

Over the last 3 weeks, we've been exploring what "Grace in Action" looks like, for God and for us. We've considered God's generosity in building the home of creation, and our call to be world-builders and homemakers, too. We've thought about God's prodigal, never ending welcome, and about our own hospitality and celebration.

This week, as we approach Commitment Sunday on October 29th, we'd like to ask you to reflect on the grace that appears when we least expect it. That's what Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan is all about, since Jews and Samaritans didn't get along in those days: imagining someone from the "other side" – of the aisle, of the debate, of the conflict – whose actions beautifully reflect the grace of God. And then to go and do likewise.

When the image of God shines brightest through our lives, we find ourselves building bridges, showing and receiving mercy, and learning from supposed "enemies." As our mission statement says, "HOPE is called by God to look beyond ourselves. We walk together in faith, treasuring all people and sharing with them the love, hope and acceptance that is in Christ." #### A Stewardship Story by Martie Guthrie:

I'd like to share with you an experience that Marc and I recently had while moving to River Falls from Nebraska. We decided to move ourselves with U-Haul vans. And we had to make two trips in order to bring everything needed.

Our first trip was in late November of last year. The first large snowfall was occurring where the area received 5 1/2 inches. It was a harrowing trip, as from Nebraska through lowa we encountered freezing rain. Then it began to snow on top of the ice that had fallen. We had windshield wiper problems that delayed us by a bit. When we reached our daughter's house in Maplewood, everything was blanketed in a soft layer of snow.

The next day we headed to the house with the van. Since we weren't too familiar with the driveway leading to our property, and there were no markers, we had to guess at where it entered and curved. While trying to navigate one curve, Marc went off the road and into the ditch with a house-full of furniture! Marc asked the realtor who she would contact to pull us out of the ditch.

We reached out to Jerry's Towing who had the truck pulled out of the ditch in no time. Then to our surprise, they continued to plow our entire driveway to the county road without being asked. WOW! What a surprise to know that our next challenging problem was taken care of by them as well.

At a time when we were literally in a different "world", and didn't have any contacts to reach out to, our angels came and took care of the problem and then some. As I'm sure you know, moving is a stressful time, with so many things needed to coordinate. To have someone come and rescue us was like a big hug at a time when we needed it. We felt that our first encounter with people from River Falls was welcoming, with compassion, grace and generosity toward us.

Then we started the mission of finding a new home church for us. Over a number of weeks, we visited several churches on Sundays, from various denominations. When we visited HOPE we were a tiny bit intimidated, walking into a rather small worship space where being a visitor was very apparent. However we were won over by your welcoming hospitality.


We could see you were involved in so many projects that reached beyond your-selves, into the surrounding community, neighborhood and world. You were being moved by a love that pays no attention to racial, religious, or socioeconomic categories. We saw in action that you were doing what God has called us to do, "To reach out to others, love one another, contribute to the needs of others, live peaceably with all". You are holy, for you are God's temple and God dwells in you.

Make us quick to welcome ventures in cooperation among the peoples of the world, so that there may be woven the fabric of a common good too strong to be torn by the evil hands of war. In the time of opportunity, make us be diligent; and in the time of peril, let not our courage fail; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

- Adults, Families, Children, & Youth are all welcome!


#### What is the format and location?




# FALL SESSION NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME




Thinking of the words from Ezekiel and Pastor Annie's recent sermon, we hope all can embrace this initiative as an opportunity to "Turn and Live". As we turn away from the convenience and availability of plastic, and seek less harmful options, we are not only sustaining life for ourselves, we protect the necessary elements of life for our world neighbors. We take a small step of faith toward cleaner water, more breathable air, and uncontaminated food for all.

As we engage in our ministry together, we encourage you to be mindful of the use of plastic supplies and packaging. - c. Prayerfully consider if you are being called to help our young people come to know and love Jesus and the world God made.


#### 2. Worship Ministry Team
