Dear HOPE Family,

Over the last few weeks, we've been exploring what "Grace in Action" looks like, for God and for us. This week, as we approach our Commitment Sunday on October 29th, we also celebrate Reformation Sunday in the Lutheran Church! For us it is *all about God's good and amazing grace!* John's words above remind us that following in the way of Jesus is to walk in the truth of God's love and grace, and living in that way sets us *free to love like Jesus*.

It sets us free to be homemakers for God's Kingdom here and now, to share God's welcome, forgiveness, and hospitality in exceedingly generous ways, to respond to the needs of our neighbors without fear or hesitation, and to be reformed and always reforming when God calls us to new ways of being God's people and Christ's Holy Church in the world!

This week, we also hear scripture from Jeremiah 31 and Psalm 46. Psalm 46 ends with "Be still and know that I am God." We are reminded that God is always with us no matter what. Trusting in this empowers us to boldly share the gifts God has given us to use in service of God's love. We do this every Sunday in worship and song, in baptism and in forming the faith of our children and youth, in our wide welcome of neighbors, and our desire to be a compassionate community of faith.

The prophet Jeremiah declares, "Behold the days are coming says the Lord when I will make a new covenant..this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people." We have God's own loving desire written on our hearts! And this Sunday, as we come forward with our new financial covenants, we do so trusting that God has given us everything we need in order to respond to the holy invitations for homemaking, prodigal hospitality, and merciful love of our neighbors.

The gifts you share support the work of others using their gifts to serve on a ministry team, to teach our children, or to reach out in new ways to our neighbors. Your financial commitment helps us care for our building that serves as our practice field for doing God's work in the world. 




FALL SESSION NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME

Our Faithful Response to Israel-Hamas War

Listen to my cry for help, for I have been brought very low; save me from those who pursue me, for they are too strong for me. -Psalm 142:6

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble- Psalm 46:1

There is no way that we can understand the full complexities of the current conflict we are witnessing. There are years, centuries, millenia of religious, political, and economic histories at play that we as American Christians can only begin to comprehend.

But I do know that our God abhors violence. I know that God weeps at the death and loss of any part of God's good creation. I know Jesus commands Peter to put his sword back in its sheath and in Peter's first letter he tells us not to repay evil for evil. I know that Jesus tells us that he has sheep in other folds. I know that God desires that all would come to know God's love and mercy. I know we worship a Savior who stands on the side of the oppressed and who, in his parables and stories, painted a just picture of God's Kingdom.

I know that we can pray for God's peace to reign.

I know that we can do our part to tend to those who are wounded physically, spiritually, and mentally in the wakes of war.

I know that we can seek to better understand our global neighbors.

So here is a prayer:

Gracious God, grant peace among nations. Cleanse from our own hearts the seeds of strife: greed and envy, harsh misunderstandings and ill will, fear and desire for revenge. Make us quick to welcome ventures in cooperation among the peoples of the world, so that there may be woven the fabric of a common good too strong to be torn by the evil hands of war. In the time of opportunity, make us be diligent; and in the time of peril, let not our courage fail; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


