

Special Guest This Sunday: Rev. Sara S.V. Bishop



This Sunday, November 12th Pastor Sara Villareal Bishop, the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin's Advocate for Right Relationships will be with us! As part of our Mission Team's focus this year to grow in our understanding of our various neighbors and strive to be better neighbors, Pastor Sara will share more about the ELCA's <u>Truth and Healing Movement</u>, and help us discover what our role in this work might be. She will share some background on the 2023 Synod Assembly Land Acknowledgement Resolution and what our faithful response to that resolution might be. Pastor Sara's Synod role functions in 3 ways:

- ⇒ Liaison point of contact between congregations, the synod, indigenous peoples/tribes, and agencies involved in work in Northwest Wisconsin; Lutheran Office for Public Policy in Wisconsin and the advocacy work of the ELCA nationally.
- ⇒ Resource Provide a forum to identify and maintain a central theology of right relationship around which Advocate and committees gather information, perspectives and action
- ⇒ Educator Lead workshops for groups, including congregation-based faith formation programs, and facilitate discussion of issues of right relationship at the congregational, conference, synod, and national level, with special focus on the annual theme for the synod.

We will have two opportunities to learn with Pastor Sara both during the sermon and during coffee fellowship following worship that Sunday! I hope you can join in this meaningful time together!

Pastor Sara's visit also aligns with <u>Native American Heritage Month</u>. November provides an opportunity for us to get to know more about our indigenous neighbors and how God is at work among their communities. Our native neighbors have rich gifts to share with us as it relates to our understanding of Creator God and our call to be part of Christ's reconciliation work for the whole world.






FALL SESSION NOW-NOVEMBER 15! ALL ARE WELCOME
