The Third Sunday of Advent | How does a weary world rejoice? We allow ourselves to be amazed


### All the Way to Joy

Welcome to Advent and Christmas 2023! This year we are asking, "How Does A Weary World Rejoice?" as we delve into the story of Luke's Gospel. Throughout our exploration, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a "thrill of hope" in our hurting world. We will welcome joy—even and especially if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isaiah 40:1).

In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice!

- ⇒ sturdy comb, remove packaging metal nail clippers (attached file optional) remove packaging



Grace Place is a shelter in New Richmond for homeless families from Pierce and St. Croix counties, run by the Salvation Army, and we send them meals five times a year.

We will need to provide food for up to fifty people - we won't know how many until closer to Christmas. We need main dishes, salads or other sides, deserts, money for milk and fruit, and a driver to deliver the food on the 26th.



5:15-Meal 6:00- Worship (Holden Evening Prayer)


